Gives them a new commandment to love as he loved them


Tells them he's leaving to prepare a place so they can join him



Jesus' Vision

In commanding his disciples to love each other as he had loved them, Jesus seemed to be envisioning a process through which his love would be perpetuated across time and space such that this new community of disciples and the multiple communities to follow would become places of transformation where the love experienced would become the love expressed.

Mindset Issue

"In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus" (Phil. 2:5 NIV)

All of us have a mindset

• Assumptions, ideas, and beliefs that influence perception, attitude, and actions

Helps us make sense of the world and construct meaning

- It affects how we see things, especially how we define success and significance
- It influences how we see people and relate to others

One of the characteristics that most distinguished Jesus from those around him was how differently he saw things

- Pharisees saw tax collectors and sinners—Jesus saw people who were sick and need a physician
- e.g., "I desire mercy not sacrifice" (Mt. 9:13)
- "When he saw the multitude, he was moved with compassion" (Mt. 9:36)

In order for Jesus' to see things so differently, his mindset must have consisted of different assumptions about success and significance than the Pharisees


Power vs Empowered—Keep the (em) in empowered



The power in Spiritempowerment is not in my ability or performance but in the Spirit's ability to take who I am and make it a witness






How is light generated?




