Chas. F. Parham, Projector of the Apostolic Faith Movement will conduct these meetings. In three services the public will be treated to the widest range of thought, for thought ever offered to the people of Topeka.

The minister being here but a short time, will endeavor to enunciate the teachings resulting from years of Earnest Prayer and Study.

Mr. Parham will preface the 11:00 A. M. sermon with an outline of his lecture on Zionism, or "The Restoration of Palestine to its Rightful Heirs." This lecture has attracted audiences of three to five thousand, while in several places ovations of crowded streets flanked the speaker enroute to the public hall.

11:00 A. M. Subject: "Where did Cain get his Wife, (has been printed in leading papers of the world.) Multitudes have attended this lecture and listened while the audience was carried in transcendant thought from the birth throes of creation through the world's noon of night to the burst of immortal dawn.

3:00 P. M. Subject: Future, Politically, Socially, Religiously, followed by a few minutes' talk on the "Liquor Question," in which the minister will make some startling pulpit utterances regarding Prohibition, after years of study and intelligent effort to suppress the joints with both Governor and Attorney General to back him. He knows just what can and cannot be done.

These remarks will furnish thought for the bigoted temperance crank as well as the sensual groveling slave of drink.

8:00 P. M. Subject: "The Jungle" or "Modern Christianity." This sermon has caused the conversion of scores of infidels. Throngs always press in to hear these utterances, flashing like the words of Martin Luther, without fear or favor.
