AMAZING SHAKARIAN STORY

Some years ago, the Full Gospel young people of the Los Angeles area decided to hold a great rally so that all the Pentecostal youth could get together for fellowship and spiritual edification. They chose Demos Shakarian as the financial head of the rally. When Demos approached some of his friends with the idea of helping finance a big one-night rally in the Shriner's Auditorium, they told him the expense would be prohibitive.

Demos and his father, Isaac, arranged for a dinner at Knott's Berry Farm, inviting the Full Gospel business men of their acquaintance. These men were told that the dinner was to be free but that an offering for the young people's rally would be taken. A large group of men attended the dinner, Before all the plans for the rally were explained, Fred Friedmeyer, Dell Arganbright, Bryan Smith and others began walking up and laying large checks on the table, some amounting to as much as \$500. This kept up for twenty minutes and \$6,200 was lying on the table.

When the rally was held in the Shriner's Auditorium, so great a crowd attended and so liberal an offering was given that after all the expenses were paid, \$5000 was left over. Then the idea came to have a great Pentecostal Rally in Hollywood Bowl. More than 22,000 people packed the Bowl to overflowing.

These feats encouraged other denominations to sponsor the great Billy Graham Revival which changed the course of events in thousands of lives in Hollywood and Los Angeles.

These events strengthened the desire of Demos Shakarian to see all Full Gospel men united in one mighty movement for God. He saw the power of united action. He talked to many others of like precious faith. At last, a number of men came together from various parts of the country and organized the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship International. Demos Shakarian was choas President, Lee Braxton, sen George Gardner and Miner Arganbright were named Vice-Presidents, and Earl Draper was selected as Secretary-Treasurer. The same day the organization was announced and the officers introduced by Oral Roberts, at Fresno, California, the Lord definitely spoke to me, urging that I offer my abilities and facilities for creating and producing an official publication for the Fellowship.

It was almost a year before this offer was accepted, during which time the Fellowship remained dormant except for a Breakfast-Broadcast in Los Angeles, almost wholly sponsored by Demos Shakarian. After deciding to accept the publication offer, it also was decided (Continued on Page 11)

Lee Braxton, International Vice-President, gave a marvelous talk on the purposes of the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship. Harold G. Kabisch, International Secretary-Treasurer, gave a general outline of the administration of the organization and I spoke on the spiritual benefits and changes that are taking place in the lives of men because of this Fellowship. Rev. Herriada of Tokyo, who is head of 250 Japanese Pentecostal Churches in Japan, gave

One man walked outside after the meeting, took his cigarettes, matches and other things in his hand and showed them to his brother and said. flew to Miami. Brother Loine Honderick, who was formerly with the Oral Roberts Healing Campaign, met us at the airport Sunday afternoon. He asked me how I would like to meet the largest dairyman in Florida. In about thirty minutes he drove us to H. C. M. Foster's ranch, where one thousand cows are milked.

Up to three years ago, Brother Foster's asthma condition had become so severe that he had to take shots to breathe. He had reached the point of not being able any longer to run his business. When he had

to take one of these shots, he would be unable to sleep for two days. His condition was beyond any medical aid, therefore, doctors had advised him to sell his business and go to some other climate and they even doubted if a change of climate would help him. When Brother Roberts' tent was brought to Miami, Brother Foster went through the prayer line. God's power was felt throughout his body. He was instantly healed. THE WALLACE NICKEL MIRACLE

When my son, Wallace Nickel, was five years old I took him and my r three other children, Bruce, Sharon, G and Douglas, for a week-end visit with my father and mother, James and Clara Nickel, who lived on the generations-old family homeplace at Nickelville, twenty-five miles west of Springfield, Missouri.

I had been Sunday School teacher for some time, first under Pastor Ralph M. Riggs and then under Pastor Bert Webb, at Central Assembly in Springfield. I and the children were speeding up Highway 66 on Sunday morning to be on hand when Sunday School opened. The speedometer on the Packard registered between sixty and seventy miles per hour. Bruce was sitting in the front seat with me. Sharon, Wallace and Douglas were in the back.

Suddenly, just as we neared Plano, sixteen miles west of Springfield, the baby, Douglas reached over to take hold of the door handle. Wallace quickly grabbed the handle to keep the baby from opening the door, but in doing so, loosened the catch himself. Like a flash, the door flew open. jerked Wallace out, and crashed against his head and body, dashing him to the pavement. When the door crashed against Wallace, the big Packard, travelling at terrific speed. shuddered as though I had hit a log on the highway. I knew no life could sustain such a shock, let alone being dashed to the pavement.

I had long believed that God could raise people from the dead and knew Christ had commanded us to go forth and raise the dead, but I had never seen this accomplished.

As I stopped the car and walked a long, long way back to where the lifeless little body lay crumpled and bruised and torn upon the edge of the pavement, a great peace and joy came upon me—something I had never felt before, nor have I felt it since.

As I picked up my little son, I noticed his skull showing through a great opening on his forehead. At the base of his skull, in the back. was a large deep hole, reaching up toward the spine and brain, with sharp pieces of rock sticking in the hole. His body was a mass of torn flesh.

Walking back to the car with the limp little form in my arms, I looked up toward Heaven and said, "Father, I need you, now. In Jesus' Name, give life back to Wallace."

Instantly the little body stiffened and blood began to spurt and gush from all the openings.

I decided to take Wallace to Saint John's Hospital in Springfield, but every heart-beat was pumping his blood out on himself, on me, on Bruce, who was holding the unconscious form, and on the seat and door of the car. I said, "Father, I thank you for giving life back to Wallace, but unless you stop the flow of blood, life cannot remain." Immed-

iately the flow of blood ceased.

As we neared the Hospital, my secretary, Mella Trotter, was on her way to Sunday School at Central Assembly. I asked her to request prayer for Wallace.

At the Hospital, Dr. George Hogeboom was in the corridor as I carried Wallace in. He and the nurses rushed him into the operating room and were in there a long time. When Dr. Hogeboom came out, he told me, "There have been two miracles performed: one is that there is life in the body and the other is that the flow of blood stopped!"

That night, about 9:30, I was sitting alone in the semi-darkness of the Hospital room with Wallace,

praying that his brain would not be affected as a result of the terrible concussion. Suddenly he opened his eyes and said cheerfully, "Daddy, I fell out of the car!" Then, feeling the wooden braces strapped tightly to his little body, he added, "Daddy, I guess this is my Cross!" He told me he felt no pain anywhere.

The next morning, Sister Leona Newberry phoned about Wallace. I told her he became conscious about 9:30 the previous night. She exclaimed, "Praise the Lord, Brother Nickel, that is just when some of us ladies at Central Assembly were praying for Wallace!"

- We believe that the Son of God, Jesus Christ, became incarnate, was begotten by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, and is true God and true man.
- We believe the Bible, in its entirety, to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and conduct.
- We believe in the resurrection of the dead, the eternal bappiness of the saved and the eternal punishment of the lost.
- We believe in personal salvation of believers, through the blood of Christ.
- We believe in sanctification by the blood of Christ; in personal boliness of beart and life, and in separation from the world.
- We believe in Divine bealing, through faith, and that bealing is included in the Atonement.
- We believe in the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, accompanied by the initial physical sign of speaking with other tongues as the Spirit of God gives utterance (Acts 2:4), as distinct from the New Birth; and in the nine Gifts of the Spirit, listed in I Corinthians 12, as now available to believers.
- We believe in the Christian's hope, the imminent, personal return of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- We believe in intensive world-evangelism and missionary work in accordance with the Great Commission, with signs following.
