## OUR CHOICE: REVIVAL OR RUIN!

I was one of fifteen ministers and chaplains invited to accompany Chief of Air Force Chaplains Major General Charles I. Carpenter to study moral and spiritual conditions of the Air Force in the Far East.

We took off from MATS Terminal, Washington, D. C., in a C54 Air Force plane; stopped at Travis Air Force Base, near San Francisco, for refueling; then to Hickman Base, Honolulu. A day and night later we left for Tokyo, refueling at Wake Island. Two days were spent in Japan and then we went to Okinawa, where 12,000 Americans died in the last war. Here we find a cross-section of the Orient, see the destruction of war, and learn how dark the heathen world can be without Christ!

Two days later we flew across the China Sea to Korea, where 125,000 Americans were casualties in the recent conflict. We saw half-naked children and the poverty of a war-torn country. The hunger and suffering I saw on those young faces I shall never forget.

We were taken to the headquarters of the Air Force of the Republic of Korea, where Major General Carpenter presented four chaplains of the ROK Air Force the Cross, to be worn over the heart and the stoles. This was a memorable day for Korea and her Air Force, and I was happy that, as Chairman of the Commission on Chaplains, I had part in that service.

Soon after, our C54 was on its way to Seoul. Here our group divided. Some stayed for Easter services in Korea, to minister to our boys at the front. I was one to return to Tokyo to minister on Easter Sunday at Tachikawa Air Force Base.

What a privilege to bring the message to the officers and men of our American Air Force, "He is not here, He is risen." That evening I had the joy of seeing 15 or 20 young men decide for Christ. That was the thrill of the entire trip! There is nothing in the wide world that gives one the joy which leading a soul to the feet of Jesus Christ gives.

# ARGENTINA IS OPENED TO THE FULL GOSPEL!

(Editor's Note: It is with deep gratitude to Louie Stokes, Angelo Arbizu and Tommy Hicks that we are able to announce to the world that Argentina has been opened to the Full Gospel. The former is a missionary in Buenos Aires and the latter two recently visited President Juan Domingo Peron, presented him with a Bible and several copies of the Full Gospel Men's Voice, in one of which was recorded the victory of Catholic Attorney Giacomo Rosapepe in Italy for the Full Gospel. President Peron received these very gratefully and gave special permission for the Full Gospel to be presented in mass meetings, over the radio and in the press thruout Argentina.)

As I write this I am preparing to open my first meeting in Buenos Aires, in the great Atlantic Stadium, seating 45,000 people. Never before in the history of this republic has there been a mass Full Gospel campaign.

President Peron gave me permission to hold mass meetings and to use the radio and press to promote the work of the Lord. He was very kind and gracious to me and we had our photograph taken together. This photo, of which I am sending a copy to Full Gospel Men's Voice, appeared in newspapers thruout South America.

Our meeting in the Temuco Country of Argentina turned out to be, by far, the greatest thing I have ever seen or heard about. The campaign was held in the great Plaza Recabarren. Night after night we saw the God of Miracles work. Thousands were saved. The multitudes were so great that it was impossible to lay hands on all the sick, so we spoke, then we prayed the commanding words of Jesus. For more than half an hour after each prayer miracle after miracle took place. Blind eyes were made to see, deaf ears were made to hear, and people everywhere wept and shouted, "I am healed!"

People walked as far as fifty miles to be in the meetings. One woman came twenty-five miles in an ox cart who had not walked for more than five years. Her body was swollen terribly. After the mass prayer she immediately went to sleep. Her people, thinking she was dying, placed her in the ox cart and started on the long journey home. All efforts to awaken her were of no avail. The next afternoon, when only a mile and a half from home, the woman awoke. She began shouting, "I am healed! I am healed! I am healed!" She had the ox cart stopped, got out and ran all the rest of the way to tell those at home the good news.

The last Sunday afternoon of the meeting, we had a parade of all the Christians. Temuco had never beheld such a sight, nor had I. That night a grand climax came as wave after wave of Glory fell, making all believers' one in Christ. The people did not go home until the wee hours of the morning, and as they departed they were praising God for His great Love for them and for the reality of the Full Gospel!

Monday found the group back in Tokyo getting ready to leave the next day for the Philippines. Wednesday morning we flew from Clark Air Force Base in the Philippines to Manila, where we were brought face to face with the horrors of war again. Buildings still bearing the scars of bombings! The walled city in ruins! The harbor filled with ships that had been bombed and sunk, still standing in Manila Bay! All an awful reminder of what war is!

With great price was my citizenship obtained for me, and Old Glory is, to me, the symbol of greatness, freedom—a religious heritage found no place else in the whole wide world. But how long can we hold this great freedom without a heaven-sent Revival? God judges sin and sin always brings the judgment of God. America, the land we love! It seems I can hear the Saviour say, as He said to Jerusalem, "How oft would I have gathered thee (America) as a hen doth gather her brood, but ye would not." We must have a Revival or our lovely cities may be in ruin as the European and Far Eastern cities are in ruin.

Our journey home was by way of Guam, Kwajalin, Honolulu and San Francisco. We arrived back in Washington, having completed 26,562 wonderful miles through

God's spacious skies and over the wonders of God's marvelous creation: the majestic Rockies, the fertile fields of grain and the vast expanse of the Pacific. As I flew through the air—in the day in the light of God's beautiful sun and at night under the stars—I had to exclaim, "The heavens declare the glory of God and the firmament showeth His handiwork."

With all of this behind me—Japan, Korea, Philippines, Guam, Kwajalin—a lingering memory haunts me of life in another world; of poverty, want and suffering; of a code of morals lower than that of the Western World. It is true that the woman is for the man out there, and especially since the war, with poverty facing the Eastern people, the moral condition of the women has gone to a new low. Remember that many of them are smart and attractive, and are the temptation of the homesick American lad. **DON'T FORGET OUR BOYS! WRITE THEM AND PRAY FOR THEM!** We need to strengthen the American home front spiritually. The moral condition of our own boys over there lies at the door of the American home where God has been omitted from the picture, and where the family altar has been broken down. We can't omit God and still maintain our moral standard. It just doesn't work that way.

While in Hawaii on our return journey we were conducted on a special tour of Pearl Harbor. As I stood on the deck of the sunken

# CATHOLIC HELPS PROTESTANTS

After Catholic Attorney Giacomo Rosapepe, of Rome, Italy, accompanied by Interpreter Alfred Perna, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, spoke at the Los Angeles Chapter of the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship, he soon returned to Italy and won a victorious verdict from the Italian Supreme Court in behalf of the Full Gospel and other Protestants in his native land.

His message follows:

\* \* \*

I am sincerely happy to be able to greet you dear friends who are listening to me this morning. I have come for the second time within a year to America, on the invitation of many dear friends who are anxious to hear from my lips the conditions of brethren in Italy. The privilege of being able to say to them, and to you, words of truth is for me a great satisfaction. I have taken an interest in the problems relative to the organization and the life of the Protestant groups in Italy, and know their desires and petitions. They have placed their trust in me because they wish to be guided in their unfortunately difficult way. My guidance is based on advice to them on how they are to listen and harmonize their work with the laws of their country—and, believe me, my task is not easy, nor has it an immediate, favorable solution.

In all the countries of the world the life of a minority is always difficult; they must struggle against

greatly superior forces, and the struggle with the stronger must be fought with different methods than with those of like strength.

I am here to tell you that your brethren in Italy are well equipped for their task and, though the beginning is hard, the words of the Gospel encourages them—which says "But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise."

They progress and reaffirm themselves every day and, too, in their new found peace in the Spirit, create works of life more wise and more lasting. I, who have seen them in the early stages making their first steps amid scorn and laughter or pity, am proud today when I hear of how much esteem with which they are now surrounded and by the same persons who previously mocked them.

You who are fortunate to live and work in a country where there is respect for the human personality—which is the foundation of civil and social life of the nation—cannot understand our jealous sentiments regarding our religion. It is for this that I desire that you turn your thoughts to my countrymen and ask you to assist them with your understanding. I am not here in your hospitable America to accuse anyone, nor condemn others' views, but only to present to responsible persons in your government solutions to important and vital problems that concern

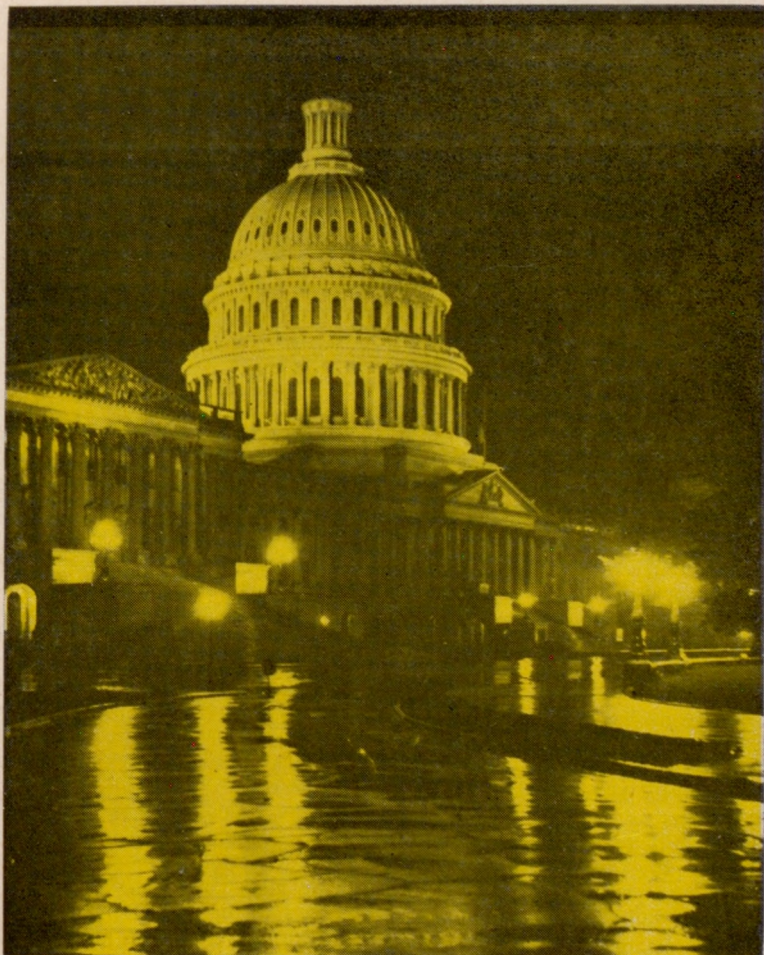

We have come to the crossroad and ministers realize they need the cooperation of every church member if they are to see the

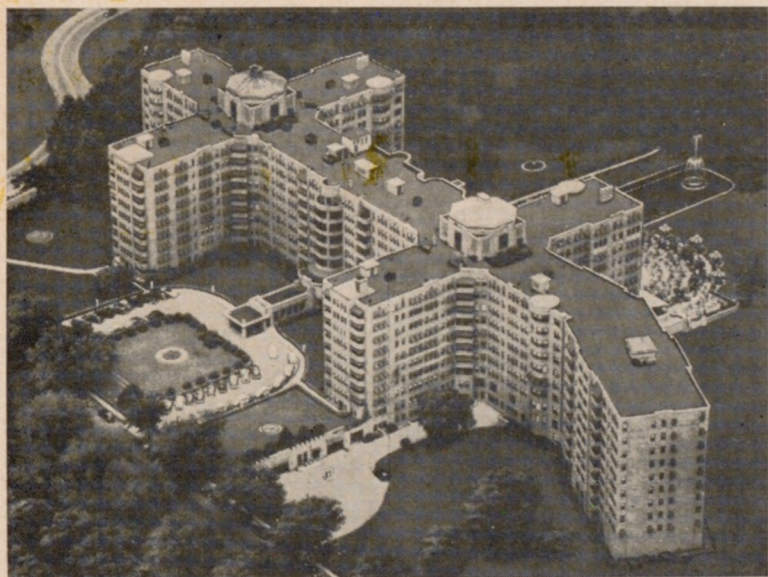

I have been here with my family of six for over six years and will stay here the rest of my life. There are no Christian magazines published in this country, therefore we are entirely dependent on what we get from abroad. We have a boat on the Lake of Gennesareth, and often we act as guides for Christian pilgrims here. If you or any of your group should visit Israel and Galilee, we shall gladly help you here. With loving greetings to you and to your co-workers from the shores of Gennesareth."

Miss Inez Kreiss, B. C. H. Mission, Orai, Jalaun Dist., U. P., India, writes: "I enjoy Full Gospel Men's Voice myself, of course, then I give it to our preachers who can understand some English, as I feel it is fine for them to see what God can do, and is doing, through His children. Out here, in India, where work is a disgrace and where only those who can flash a degree are looked upon as anyone who can do any

thing, it is good for our men. There are thousands of little groups like ours, made up mostly of workers, preachers, Bible women, school teachers, nurses, and others who love the Lord. We take the Gospel to some 400 villages in this territory. The followers of Hinduism have learned the power of the printed Word and threaten with curses any who dare buy our literature. In spite of the battle, one man walked thirty-eight miles to buy a Bible at Christmas time with money for which he had worked and saved six years."

C. H. Stone, Houston, Texas, writes: "Will you kindly advise me whether a group of your Fellowship is active in Houston? If not, I would be much interested in learning how to go about establishing the activity here. My interest is to see such a movement go rapidly forward for the glory of God."

W. W. Simpson, who spent over 60 years as Missionary in China, Tibet, Mongolia and Manchuria, now of Riverbank, California, writes: "The same Communists who forced missionaries out of China are forcing a great number of Chinese to come to America, where they can



be more conveniently evangelized. Will the Lord hold us guiltless if we fail to take advantage of this opportunity? Perhaps the Full Gospel Business Men could help me establish a Full Gospel Chapter in Chinatown, San Francisco. If so I shall be very thankful."

your brethren. We must obtain for you—who have generously given American dollars to construct churches, orphanages and Bible schools in Italy—an assurance that these may not be lost to you by payment of taxes that need not be paid. I wish to keep intact the institutions for education and training which you have created in Italy with your sacrifices, so that they all remain and prosper to the end they are intended

for.

My only desire is that your government protect your interests in Italy so that they may flourish. I wish to impress on your government that your missionaries be permitted to go to Italy without any complicated procedure and, above all, to be able to care for the works that have been started.

I cannot state too emphatically the gravity of the task that concerns the life of the spirit—it cannot fail to be



brought to a happy conclusion.

In me and in my work are founded the hopes and anxieties of over 200 thousand of my countrymen. They follow me with their prayers for my success. They know they could never pay the taxes, but know also that they cannot close the doors to their churches. It would be a terrible day if I should have to tell them that nothing could be accomplished. I beg of you, therefore, my dear friends, to give earnest consideration to what I have said, and, to the limit of your ability, try to back me in my task. This accomplishment would eventually create for my country that peaceful co-living of different beliefs—and I am certain that the first to benefit from this will be those who today are trying to hinder and impede our goal.

I believe that progress in the Evangelization in Italy will contribute to the uplifting of the living conditions in my country. I have faith in the wisdom of your government—and, above all, one faith sus-

battleship, Arizona, which had become the tomb of so many of our boys who gave their lives, not knowing just what had happened, and as I looked to the west I could, in my mind, see again those planes of the Japanese as they came roaring in to bring death and destruction. Permit me to close by quoting these words from the Word of God—"I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Jesus Christ." (Philippians 3:14)

## Preamble to Constitution of International Fellowship

While there are, already, international organizations for the furtherance of Christian Fellowship among men, and cooperative action in the Lord's work, we are led of the Lord to establish, by his enabling grace, an international fellowship organization of men who are "full gospel" believers, as defined in this Constitution. Some of the needs which this fellowship is designed to meet are: to supply means for spiritual fellowship in Christ, not now available elsewhere, among full gospel believing men; to promote effective co-operation of such men, in gospel work; to unite in the Lord's fellowship and work, groups of men characterized by more complete responsiveness to the movings of the Holy Spirit, and to establish an organized work which will strengthen Full Gospel Churches everywhere.

It is to these objectives that Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship International is dedicated. By faith we commit this work unto the Lord, in full confidence that, according to His promise, our "thoughts shall be established".
