Galenda, Kan., January 1--The evangelistic meetings which have been held at this place by Rev. Parham for the past six weeks celebrated the New Year's by baptizing the converts in Spring river this afternoon.

These meetings have been a success from the beginning and fully 500 have been converted. Some have already been immersed, but today's list counts 250. Many of the most prominent people in town have professed to having been healed of blindness, cancer, rheumatism and other diseases, and it has been such a spritual revival as Galena has not experienced in years, if ever.
