dad, Irak. I have been visiting in the very Cradle of Civilization in of Saul and David. the land of Shinar, Mesopotamia. This country has not advanced much since Abraham's time.

At present, due to the excessive melting of snow and early rain, the Tigris and Euphrates rivers are on a rampage not equaled in the memory of the oldest natives. Even down to Babylon we will take a boat part of the way.

George Carmichael and John Mendenhall are with me. We are staying at the YMCA in Baghdad.

Tomorrow we probably will go up to Nineveh. We have permits for Iran to the country of Esther and Mordecai.

We went to a place I had long wanted to see, the Cave Adullam, where David lived for awhile. The Cave is in the Tekoa country of Amos, about 30 miles Southeast of Jerusalem. We took a Tekoa sheep herder along as a guide. He led us down the canyon and along a ledge of rock to the Cave's entrance. After going through the entrance there are many passages.

ARGENTINA REVIVAL NOTED BY DOCTORS

The July 24, 1954, issue of Journal of the American Medical Association, Vol. 155, No. 13, in their Foreign Letter report from Argentina, says:

"An American evangelist, Tommy Hicks, from Lancaster, Calif., has been speaking to groups of 10.000 to 40.000 persons assembled on football fields. He claims that faith in God can completely cure most diseases. Many people of Buenos Aires, having become conditioned to the authority of radio addresses, are readily impressed by anything broadcast over a loudspeaker. The number of persons announcing the cure of cancer, hypertension, etc. without any demonstrable evidence has greatly increased."

Through the newspapers of South America, reports have come to us that the crowds were from 100,000 to 400,000 and that the cures of cancer, hypertension, etc. were miraculous and numerous beyond anything previously on record in the history of man.

The Full Gospel Men's Voice first announced this great event in May, 1954, and will carry another story about Tommy Hicks' ministry in Argentina in the next issue. Our Doctrinal Statement

We believe in one God, Maker of all things, and being in Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

- We believe that the Son of God, Jesus Christ, became incarnate, was begotten by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, and is true God and true man.
- We believe the Bible, in its entirety, to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and conduct.
- We believe in the resurrection of the dead, the eternal happiness of the saved and the eternal punishment of the lost.
- We believe in personal salvation of believers, through the blood of Christ.
- We believe in sanctification by the blood of Christ; in personal holiness of beart and life, and in separation from the world.
