Recent developments in Zion City, show that Parham objects to his followers shouting at the top of their voices when they become possessed of the "Gift of Tongues." He is says that it is his wish that they refrain from any boisteriousness and that they accept the gift from the Almighty with becoming meekness

It seems that it has been the habit of many of the followers of Parham when they became possessed of the gift of tongues to jump to their feet and shout at the top of their voices.

Parham objects to this demonstration and says that it is just as easy for them to accept the gift in silence as it is to make so much noise about it.

Another very interesting thing developed in Zion City with the return of Parham from his western trip.

It was at the close of the New Years services. Parham had just finished preaching the first sermon after his return. He hurried to the door of the tent to welcome everybody as they departed and to wish them a Happy New Year.

As they passed through the door, he would graps them by the hand and shake it heartily. In many cases, however, this demonstration on his part was not warmly received. Several jerked their hands away and passed on with a scornful glance, as if they thought that his familiarity was distasteful in the extreme.

Another man was so fearful that he would have to shake

hands with Parham that he got just as near the door as he could without getting within the reach of Parham. Then watching his chance, when Parham was shaking another man by the hand he darted out the door and made off as fast as he could. Evidently, they were followers of Voliva who had attended the meeting merely out of curiosity.

PENTECOST IN TORONTO? PREACHER HERE SAYS SO

Charles Parham and Some of the Gifts of Tongue Resulting From His Meetings.

There is a man now in Toronto who firmly believes that Toronto is to have the "gift of tongues," and who detaches great chunks of Scripture and hurls them at the head of the umbeliever and sceptic.

This man is Charles F. Parham, now holding meetings in Wolseley Hall, at Yonge and Gerrard-streets. Mr. Parham is fresh from holdings meetings at Toledo, Ohio, where according to the Toledo press, many converts were made, several received the "gift of tongues," and hundreds of interested citizens were turned away from the meetings.

Mr. Parham told The World that in October, 1900, he was led of God to open a Bible school in Topeka, Kansas, where some 40 students entered for the study of the Bible. No fees were charged, no collections made, no solicitation, no board money, no nothing, but that day after day, God filled their mouths and supplied all their wants in answer to their prayers.
