THE COMING OF THE "WORLD TEACHER"

We have been watching intently, along with many others, the many preparations pointing to the soon coming of the Lord to catch His bride away. And then, of course, the preparation of the world for the coming of the tribulation and the reign of the Anti-Christ. As rapidly as the Bride is making herself ready, the world is making itself ready for the anti-Christ from every standpoint, and especially so from a religious standpoint.

There is a movement called the "Order of the Star in the East," a bloodless religions denying all the fundamentals of the Gospel, and of course fostered by the devil himself, but under a false guise, that is promoting the coming of the "World Teacher." And they claim the name of "Christianity" and make much ado about "love" and the "broad-mindedness" of God, and ascribe all religions to Jesus as the founder of them all. In other words, the devil is planting these characters in various churches. Like the worm that bores through to the heart of the apple and when you cut into the apple you find the interior is rotten. And to a more or less extent the spirit of the age has crept into the ranks of most every movement including to some extent the holiness ranks, under the "cloak of love" and "broad-mindedness."

The ranks of most every evangelical movement have been bored through until the core is rotten. Infidelity and skepticism have swept much of the ministry into its ranks, and many pro-

fessed ministers are pouring a stream of skepticism into the church today.

The Pentecostal ranks are bordering on some of the same things. And unless the leaders watch very closely and keep the movements sprayed with the truth of the Gospel, sooner or later they are liable to the same contamination.
